people in different types of uniform, representing many military and volunteer services. Have you ever worn a uniform?

Did the uniform affect your behaviour in any way? What about the uniforms worn by, say, sports teams, the military, emergency services, church ministers? Wearing a uniform makes you a representative of that organisation. And that, in turn, may mean that you are expected to act or behave in a certain way. Of course, that may be true even if a uniform is not required. Members of an organisation are often expected to act in accordance with the organisation's values. Most Christians (leaving aside minsters and Salvation Army) don't usually wear uniforms.

We may choose to display badges such as a cross, or fish or a dove to show our allegiance, but equally we don't have to. Nonetheless, if we say that we are Christians, others might expect certain attitudes and behaviour of us.

Our natural appearance is a fact of biology – our DNA, which governs things such as eye and skin colour. That is why we share some characteristics with our blood relatives, whether we like it or not! Other traits we learn from those we live with or admire. These influences have a big effect on our habits and actions, and we might change appearance, or adopt interests and habits, that resonate with our heroes or role models. Some of these we can put on or take off, but sometimes they may so root themselves in our personality that they truly become part of the us. It was that sort of inner change that people noticed about the first Christians, such as the apostles...and Stephen. It is the work of the Spirit of Jesus in us. It's not sandals, beads and beards that reveal Jesus, but seeing his
