I mean that, if I am not saved by Jesus Christ, I shall be a lost soul in Hell for ever.

9. How can you save your soul?

I can save my soul by trusting Jesus Christ to wash away my sins, and by living a good life.

10. Can children really trust in Jesus, and be good?

Children can really trust in Jesus and be good, for He said, "Suffer little children to come unto Me, and forbid them not, for of such is the Kingdom of Heaven."

11. Why should you learn this Directory?

I should learn this Directory that I may know how to be a good Soldier in The Army, and to go to Heaven when I die.

**CHAPTER I.
GOD.**
1. You say that God made you. Who is God?

God is the Creator and Father of all things.

2. Can we see God?

No, God is an Eternal Spirit.

3. Are there more Gods than one?

There is one God, the living and the true God.

4. Are there more persons than one in God?

There are three persons in God: the Father, the Son, and the Holy Ghost, and these three are one God.

5. Is God everywhere?

God is everywhere. He sees us when we do right, and He sees us when we do wrong.

6. Does God know everything?

God knows everything, and therefore knows all we think, and feel, and say, and do.

7. Is God all-powerful?

God is almighty.

8. Is God perfectly good?

God is perfectly good, and cannot do wrong.

9. Is God true and faithful?

God is true and faithful. His promises can never fail.

10. Is God merciful?

God is merciful. He pities those who do wrong, and is always ready to forgive them.

CHAPTER II.

THE CREATION OF THE WORLD.

1. Who made the world?

The world was created by God. He spoke, and it was made.

2. Then the world did not make itself?

The world could not make itself. Just as every house that we see had a maker, so the world had a Maker, and the Maker of the world was God.

3. When did God make man?

After God had created the world, He made our first parents, Adam and Eve.

The Creation of the World.

4. Did God make Adam and Eve pure and good?

God made Adam and Eve pure and good; that is, without sin.

5. What is sin?

Sin is doing what is wrong.

6. How did Adam and Eve become sinners?

Adam and Eve fell into sin through disobedience. They ate the fruit of a tree which God told them not to eat.

7. What was the result of this Fall?

The Fall of Adam and Eve made God angry, and their hearts became sinful, and they were driven out of the Garden of Eden.

8. Did this Fall make a difference to the world?

The Fall of Adam and Eve brought sin and sorrow and death into the world.

9. Are we all sinners?

We are all the children of Adam and Eve, and therefore we are all born with sinful hearts.

CHAPTER III.

THE FOUR LAST THINGS.

1. What are the four last things?

The four last things are the Resurrection of the Dead, the Judgment, Heaven, and Hell.

THE RESURRECTION.

2. What do you mean by the Resurrection of the Dead?

By the Resurrection of the Dead I mean that all the dead people will one day be raised to Life again.

THE JUDGMENT.

3. What is the Judgment?

The Judgment is that great day when God will bring all people before His Throne to give an account of their lives.

4. How will God judge the people?

At the Judgment God will separate the good people from the wicked, and will reward the good and punish the wicked.

5. What will God say to the good people?

God will say to the good, "Come, ye blessed of My Father, to the Kingdom prepared for you."

6. What will He say to the wicked?

God will say to the wicked, "Depart from Me, ye cursed, for ever."

HEAVEN.

7. What is Heaven?

Heaven is the Home of God and the angels, and is a beautiful, holy and happy place.

8. Will there be any sin or sorrow in Heaven?

There will be nothing in Heaven to hurt us, or to make us sorry, and we shall never die.

9. Will there be joys in Heaven?

In Heaven there will be music and singing and every other thing that will make us happy.

10. Shall we see our Saviour in Heaven?

We shall see our Saviour in Heaven, and that will be the best of all.

11. Shall we know our friends in Heaven?

We shall surely know our friends when we meet them again in Heaven.

12. What kind of people go to Heaven?

All Jesus Christ's good Soldiers will go to Heaven when they die.

13. Will Heaven last for ever?

Heaven will last for ever.

HELL.

14. What is Hell?

Hell is a dreadful place where wicked people go when they die.

15. Who will be in Hell?

The devil and all the people who will not be saved.

16. How long will Hell last?

Hell will last for ever.

CHAPTER IV.

THE LORD JESUS CHRIST.

1. Did the Fall of Adam and Eve grieve God?

The Fall of Adam and Eve, and the sin and misery it brought into the world, have been a great sorrow to God.

2. Does God keep on loving the world in spite of sin?

God loves the world and longs to save the sinners.

3. Has God done anything to save the sinners?

God gave Jesus to die that all might be saved from sin and its awful punishment.

4. Who is Jesus Christ?

Jesus Christ is the Son of God.

5. Are there two natures in Jesus Christ?

There are two natures in Jesus Christ: the nature of God and the nature of man.

6. Why did Jesus Christ come into the world?

Jesus Christ came into the world to save sinners.

7. How does Jesus Christ save sinners?

By His life, His death, and His resurrection.

8. What is there in Jesus Christ's life that leads to Salvation?

The way Jesus Christ lived, and the truth He taught lead us to Salvation.

9. Must we obey the teaching of Jesus Christ?

We must obey the words of Jesus, for He said that those who do so will be saved.

10. Is Jesus Christ our example?

Jesus is our example, and we must try to be good and kind as He is.

11. What blessings may we have through the death of Jesus Christ?

Through the death of Jesus our sins may be forgiven, we can be kept good while we live, and go to Heaven when we die.

12. Can all men be saved through the death of Jesus Christ?

All men can be saved if they repent and believe in Jesus as their Saviour.

13. Was it not most loving of Jesus to come down from Heaven to suffer and die for us?

It was most wonderful love that brought Jesus from Heaven to suffer and die for us

14. What is the meaning of the name "Jesus"?

The name "Jesus" means "Saviour."

15. Why is Jesus called a Shepherd?

Because we are like lost sheep, and Jesus wants to bring us into His fold to be safe.

16. Does Jesus love us now as tenderly as when He was on the earth?

Jesus loves us now as tenderly as He loved the people when He was on the earth.

17. Is Jesus sorry for those who will not be saved?

Jesus is very sorry for those who will not be saved.

18. Does Jesus know all about our trials?

Jesus knows all about our trials, and, if we ask Him, will help us in them.

19. Does Jesus know about our temptations?

Jesus knows all about our temptations, and will help us to conquer them if we obey Him.

20. Will Jesus help us to obey Him?

Jesus always helps those who try to obey Him by sending His Spirit into their hearts.

CHAPTER V.
THE BIBLE.

1. What does the word "Bible" mean?

The word "Bible" means "The Book."

2. Why is the Bible specially called "The Book"?

The Bible tells us the will of God, and so it is the best book in the world.

3. Has God told us in the Bible about Himself and His wishes?

The Bible tells us how good God is, and what great things He has done.

4. Has God told us in the Bible what sort of people we ought to be?

The Bible tells us the kind of children we ought to be, and how we ought to live.

PART II.—EXPERIENCE.

CHAPTER I.

SIN.

1. What is it to Sin?

To sin is to do anything we know to be wrong.

2. Is every sin a wrong against God?

Every sin is a wrong against God.

3. Is it sinful to leave undone what we know we ought to do?

It is sinful to leave undone what we know we ought to do.

4. Is sin a terrible evil?

Sin is a terrible evil, and it brings misery and punishment.

5. Is it very wrong to lead other children into sin?

When we lead other children into wrong-doing we are worse than they are.

6. Does God keep a list of our sins?

A list of our sins is kept in God's Book of Remembrance.

CHAPTER II.**THE FORGIVENESS OF SINS.****1. What is it to be saved?**

"To be saved" means that God has forgiven our sins through Jesus Christ our Saviour, and that we are living to please Him.

2. What is the forgiveness of sins?

The forgiveness of sins is the pardon of all our wrong-doings.

3. Who forgives sins?

God forgives sins, and God only.

4. Why must we seek the forgiveness of our sins?

We must seek forgiveness because sin takes us away from God, and if we die unforgiven we shall be sent away from Him for ever.

5. Does being saved mean anything besides having our sins forgiven?

Being saved means being truly converted as well as being forgiven.

6. What is Conversion?

Conversion is getting a new heart from God.

7. How does Jesus Christ speak of conversion?

Jesus says that conversion is "being born again," which means that it is the beginning of a new life.

8. Can we know whether we are now saved?

We can know whether we are now saved or not.

9. How can you know that you are saved?

I shall know that I am saved if Jesus tells me so in my heart, and if I am good, and try to please Him.

CHAPTER III.

THE CONDITIONS OF SALVATION.

1. What must we do to be saved?

Those who wish to be saved must seek salvation, repent and give up their wicked ways, and trust in Jesus to save them.

2. What is meant by seeking Salvation?

Seeking salvation means desiring it, and earnestly asking God for it.

3. What is Repentance?

Repentance is real sorrow for having sinned against God.

4. What is trusting in Jesus to save us?

Trusting in Jesus to save us is believing that God for Jesus' sake forgives all our sins.

5. When God saves us do we then belong to Him?

When God saves us we are His own dear children.

PART III.—OBEDIENCE.

CHAPTER I.

HOW TO KEEP SAVED.

1. Can we keep saved all our lives?

God will keep us saved all our lives if we trust in Him and try to do His will.

2. What is trusting in God?

Trusting in God is believing that He loves us very much, and that He will take care of us if we serve Him.

3. If you are naughty or grow cold, what must you do?

I ought to be very sorry when I am naughty, and at once ask Jesus to forgive me, and keep on trying to be good.

CHAPTER II.

PRAYER.

1. Ought little children to pray?

Little children ought to pray often.

2. To whom ought you to pray?

I ought to pray to my Father in Heaven.

3. What is prayer?

Prayer is asking God for the things that we want, either for ourselves or for others.

4. How ought you to pray?

(Morning.) O Lord, I thank Thee for taking care of me in the night. Help me to be a good boy (*or girl*) to-day. Make me very obedient and very kind, and bless my dear father and mother, and everyone in our house, and make us all good, through Jesus Christ our Saviour, who died for us. Amen.

(Evening.) O Lord, I thank Thee for Thy mercies to me this day, and for all the good things Thou hast given me. Bless all the poor little children who have no home and friends, and keep our Army, and help it to tell all the world of Thy love. Bless my dear father and mother, and brothers and sisters, and help us all to love and serve Thee, and take us safe to Heaven when we die. Now I give myself to Thee. Keep me in the night, for Jesus Christ's sake. Amen.

5. What is the meaning of "Amen"?

"Amen" means: O Lord, let my prayer be answered.

6. Ought children to pray before they take their food?

Children ought always to thank God for their food before they eat it.

7. How should you thank God for your food?

Close your eyes, and then say the following words from your heart:—

"God bless the food which now I take,
And make me good, for Jesus' sake."

CHAPTER III.

DOING RIGHT.

1. How can you keep on pleasing Jesus?

By doing right every day.

2. How must you do right?

I must always speak the truth. God hates story-telling and lies.

3. Must you be obedient?

I must always do as I am told, very quickly.

4. How must you be honest?

I must never take what is not my own. That would be stealing.

5. Must you be kind to everybody?

I must be very kind to everybody, and never hurt or tease the animals, because they are God's creatures.

6. What do you mean by modesty?

I must be modest and tidy, and never do anything that is rude to myself or to anyone else.

7. Is it wrong to use bad words?

I must never use bad words or go into bad tempers. God will hear me and be angry with me if I do.

8. What does The Army teach about Temperance?

I must never drink strong drink or smoke tobacco.

9. What about Sunday?

I must always keep Sunday as the Lord's Day, and go to the meetings if I can.

10. Whom must you love?

I must love all the people who are kind to me, and forgive those who are unkind, and I must pray for those who call me names because I am in The Army.

CHAPTER IV.**THE ARMY.****1. Does God wish you to go to The Army?**

God wishes me to go to The Salvation Army meetings as often as I can.

2. Has God sent The Army to show you how to get saved and be good?

God has sent The Army to teach me how to be saved and to serve Him.

3. Must I obey my Sergeants in The Army?

I must obey my Sergeants, or Teachers, in The Army.

4. Must I love and pray for them?

I must always love and pray every day for my Sergeants, or my Teachers, in The Army, and try to help other children to do the same.

5. Will God be angry with me if I do not carry out what I am told to do at The Army?

Yes, God will be angry with me if I disobey my Officers, who seek my salvation.

6. Ought I to pray for the Captain?

Yes, I ought to pray for my dear Captain, and all our Officers, and the dear General.

REPEAT THE LORD'S PRAYER.

"Our Father which art in Heaven, Hallowed be Thy name. Thy Kingdom come. Thy will be done on earth, as it is in Heaven. Give us this day our daily bread; and forgive us our trespasses, as we forgive them that trespass against us; and lead us not into temptation, but deliver us from evil: for Thine is the Kingdom, and the power, and the glory, for ever. Amen."

WHAT ARE THE BLESSINGS OF JESUS?

1. "Blessed are the poor in spirit, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."
2. "Blessed are they that mourn, for they shall be comforted."
3. "Blessed are the meek, for they shall inherit the earth."
4. "Blessed are they which do hunger and thirst after righteousness, for they shall be filled."
5. "Blessed are the merciful, for they shall obtain mercy."

6. "Blessed are the pure in heart, for they shall see God."

7. "Blessed are the peacemakers, for they shall be called the children of God."

8. "Blessed are they which are persecuted for righteousness' sake, for theirs is the Kingdom of Heaven."


NAME THE TEN PRECIOUS GRACES.

WHAT ARE THE ARMY'S SYMBOLS?

The Three Army Symbols are:—

1. The Flag (see picture), the colours of which are Red, Yellow, and Blue.

(a) Red signifies the Blood of Christ.


(b) Yellow signifies the Fire of the Holy Ghost.

(c) Blue signifies the Purity of the Soul.

2. The Army Crest (see picture) sets forth the Army Doctrines as follows:—

(a) The round figure, which means the sun, represents the light and fire of the Holy Ghost.

(b) The cross in the centre represents the Cross of our Lord Jesus Christ.



(c) The letter "S" stands for Salvation.

(d) The swords represent the Warfare of Salvation.

(e) The shots represent the truths of the Gospel.

(f) The crown represents the Crown of Glory, which God will give to His Soldiers who are faithful to the end.

3. The Army Salute.

The Salute is a hand raised (see picture), and is a sign of Salvation greeting and respect.
