# Budget 2021-22

Headquarters have approved Chalk Farm Corps budget. The Corps has been granted £69,000 in Mission Support Funding this coming year in order to meet its anticipated costs. This is less than in recent years but remains significant. Our thanks go to everyone who has contributed to the Corps over this last year and to several donors who funded our COVID response. Chalk Farm Corps budget has been circulated to all members of the Corps Mission Council and a summary is available upon request.
