'...for everyone born of God overcomes the world. This is the victory that has overcome the world, even our faith. Who is it that overcomes the world? Only the one who believes that Jesus is the Son of God.'

(1 John 5: 4-5, NIV).

The hustle and bustle of Camden is steadily returning as the country eases out of lockdown. The change of atmosphere is remarkable. Questions still abound – *will it return to as it was before?* People are preparing to move forward. Many people go to pastures knew having to find new employment following redundancy or to work through difficulties thrown up by the pandemic and lockdowns. At Chalk Farm Salvation Army we have many questions about what we will look like as we return. *What might we become? Where will our energies be focused in future days? How can we best respond to the needs thrown up by the pandemic?*

Turning to Ezra we read of God's people beginning to rebuild after a time of great trial. They had returned from exile in Babylon and with mixed emotions began to rebuild the ruins of what they left behind some years before. We read in Ezra 3: 1-6 that first came the rebuilding of the altar and this was followed by the rebuilding of the Temple (Ezra 3: 7-13). I thought this a little strange as surely the altar was to be inside the Temple? Then I got to thinking about the importance of our own lives being laid upon the altar for God before the building up of the Church can take place. In actual fact the altar from the first Temple was in use throughout the period of exile but Ezra wished a new altar to be built for the returning community. Once the altar was built and used it was time to rebuild the Temple.

What follows is remarkable as it encompasses a tension. It is an act of both praise and of mourning. We read in Ezra 3;

'When the builders laid the foundation of the temple of the Lord, the priests in their vestments and with trumpets, and the Levites (the sons of Asaph) with cymbals, took their places to praise the Lord, as prescribed by David king of Israel. With praise and thanksgiving they sang to the Lord:

"He is good; his love toward Israel endures forever."

And all the people gave a great shout of praise to the Lord, because the foundation of the house of the Lord was laid. But many of the older priests and Levites and family heads, who had seen the former temple, wept aloud when they saw the foundation of this temple being laid, while many others shouted for joy. No one could distinguish the sound of the shouts of joy from the sound of weeping, because the people made so much noise. And the sound was heard far away.' (Ezra 3: 10-13, NIV).

In stage 2 of our Mission Journal we appreciate what has gone before and begin to lay new foundations for Chalk Farm Corps. Some will shout with joyful praise, others may weep for what once was and I suspect people, like myself, will do both and that's OK because; *God is good and His love toward us endures forever!* A beautiful song of Catherine Baird reads:

*Eternal God, our song we raise
In thankful, overflowing praise,
For men of faith whose power was thine,
Whose love no barrier could confine;
They humbly offered Christ their bread,
And lo, the multitudes were fed!*

*We thank thee for the fruitful years,
The sacred gains of toil and tears,
For mighty works through weakness wrought,
For souls who led in deed and thought;
They followed Jesus in the light
And their loud anthems thrilled the night*

*O may no longing of our own
Obscure the path by Jesus shown!
We would not thirst for earth's reward
And lose the blessing of our Lord:
His cup of pain and grief and strife
That yieldeth up the gift of life.*

*Our Father, we beseech thee now:
Receive again our first pure vow
To stand though fire and tempest rage,
Nor fear the terrors of our age,
To love thee with a constant mind
And lose ourselves to save mankind.*

*Our great redeemer liveth still,
His love sustains us in thy will;
Because he conquered, we shall win,
His cross before, his joy within;
Our cheerful banners are unfurled,
For Christ has overcome the world.*


