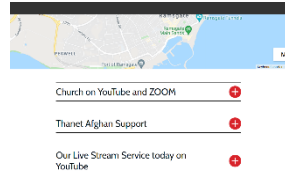

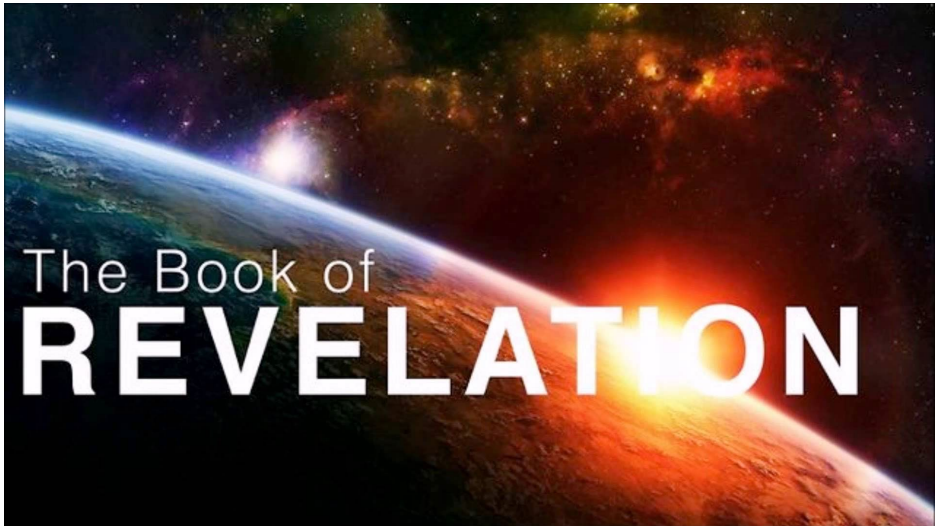

When the lockdown started last year, Dave's savings as a self-employed decorator dried up. His partner Tracy had to go to the Salvation Army foodbank, where his two young children would have gone hungry. One helper sees kindness itself and give her everything she needed. Things are better now and Dave is starting again, but Tracy says: 'It's so grateful I can have The Salvation Army to save it when things get tough.'



You can give HOPE

Jack became homeless after his wife died and he had a mental breakdown. Sleeping rough, he lost all hope and self-respect. But when he was referred to one of The Salvation Army's Lifelines (voluntary centres for homeless people) it changed his life. One team of staff and volunteers welcomed him as a friend and helped him rebuild his self-confidence. Now he's training for a vocational qualification so that he can get back into work.



You can give FRIENDSHIP

Heather was devastated when her husband passed away during the pandemic and she was left completely alone. Fortunately a neighbour phoned the local Salvation Army and we helped Heather through the crisis planning her regularly and encouraging her a volunteer to pick up her shopping. Now she's joined the regular lunch club that we organise in her neighbourhood. She says: 'Things are still not easy, but thanks to you I'm starting to live again.'

For years Janet and her two sons lived in fear of her violent husband. But their nightmare ended when she was referred to a specialist Salvation Army centre for abused women and children. At last they were free from all the fear and pain. Our specialist staff helped Janet to recover from her long ordeal. And now she is planning a new future, with a new job, and a new home where she and the children can be a happy family.

Big Collection 2021

Thank you for your amazing work and service throughout the pandemic. It's been a tough 18 months and, sadly, the effects of COVID-19 will be with us for a long time. Inevitably, the number of people turning to Salvation Army support will increase in coming months. The 2021 Big Collection provides us with a valuable opportunity to invite people to donate money so our Army can help and love others in the name of Jesus. Last week, the Cabinet approved changes to The Big Collection with immediate effect. We want to breath new life into The Big Collection by giving corps opportunity to say where the money is used. In doing so, we hope to create a stronger link between people who give time, energy and money and the people who benefit from that generosity. Some of you might wonder why we still need corps to raise money for The Big Collection. The amount of money raised has halved in the past 20 years – why don't we just cancel it? In a normal year, The Big Collection still raises more than £1.3 million. We need to be good stewards of the resources God continues to bless us with. In 2020, despite not being able to do house-to-house collecting, The Big Collection raised 62% of the 2019 total. Thank you to those corps who showed their practical support and love for our social ministry. The Big Collection is the only annual fundraising campaign when every penny raised goes towards Salvation Army social services in our territory. It is also an important opportunity for corps members to support and learn more about our amazing work – from Lifehouses for people experiencing homelessness, to safe houses protecting the victims and survivors of modern slavery; from programmes helping people get a job and learn new skills, to finding missing relatives or helping people out of debt – and more!

So what is changing? First, we are not setting corps targets at THQ. We leave that decision to corps leadership. You know your circumstances and capacities. This is a most unusual time, so we don't want to add to your burdens, but we want to make the most of our opportunities. Please do everything you can – this is important Kingdom-building work. Nearly all corps commit and contribute to the Self-Denial Appeal, for the Army's work overseas, so we ask people to feel as passionate about needs in our own country.

Fundraising for The Big Collection can be done in as many ways as you can imagine! Some people still find house to house collecting is productive. In other parts of the country it is no longer feasible for many reasons.

So what can we do?

We will invite you all to make a personal donation to the appeal and you will receive offering envelopes next week. There will be a special themed service on Sunday 26th September to receive your offering

We will (hopefully) be permitted to collect in the streets.

But what else? We would love to hear your suggestions for fund raising. Please let us know.
