An Epiphany!

Unfortunately wishing to add a surprise gift of my own I searched for the most popular gifts recommended on a well known internet site and yes, you guessed it, my purchase was not a good choice and I fear may end up at a jumble sale later this year!

January's news edition includes various articles around our busy Christmas programme and our wonderful supporters. After all this busyness we now we enter the season of Epiphany. Epiphany derives from the Greek word 'to reveal' and Christians traditionally consider the Magi visiting Jesus as the revealed messianic king of the Jews – even more than that the Son of God.

Those Magi were certainly not Jewish and yet Christ was revealed to them. As far back as Genesis 49: 10 we read a prophesy; 'All the nations of the world shall in the future bring a gift to the Son of David'.

The Magi came bearing their gifts of; gold for Jesus as King; frankincense, for Jesus as divine since it was used in religious worship and myrrh, for Jesus' dying since it was used in embalming (John 19: 39).

All three gifts would have been expensive, aside from the precious gold, the frankincense and myrrh are aromatic gum resins not native to Palestine and at the time had religious and medical use. The magi indeed chose their gifts wisely.

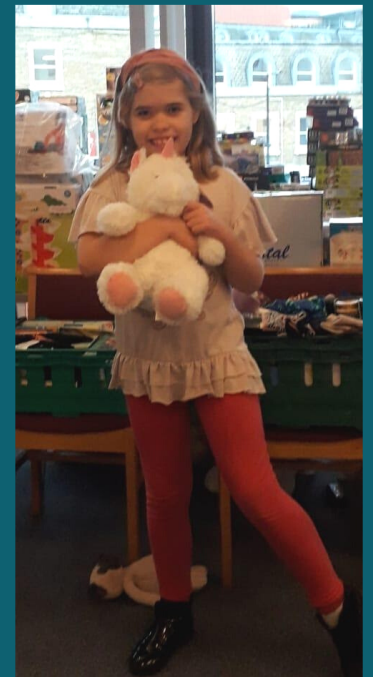
Morrisons Community Champion, Charlie-Ann Perry, presents Christmas gift bags for the homeless and boxes of chocolates for our work with older people.

Our Christmas Carolling efforts this year raised a total of £3,969.70.

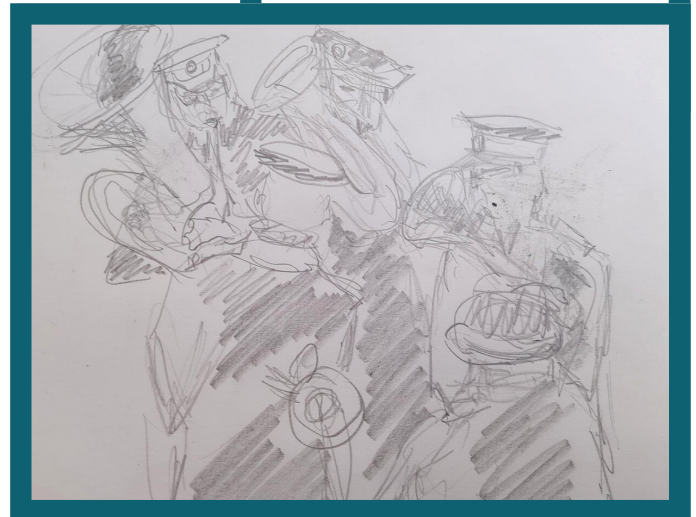
Special thanks to Chalk Farm Band, William Booth College Cadets Band, Regent Brass Band, and our valiant collectors.
