CAPTAIN ANDREW P. HAUCK, U.S.A., died after several months illness, aged 35, out of San Francisco in 1887, promoted lieutenant in January 1888. In August of the same year he was promoted to be captain and appointed to Alameda. He afterwards had a number of field appointments, until in 1892, owing to failing health, he was given an appointment on the Headquarters, San Francisco, where he performed his work faithfully until obliged to give up four months previous to his death.
