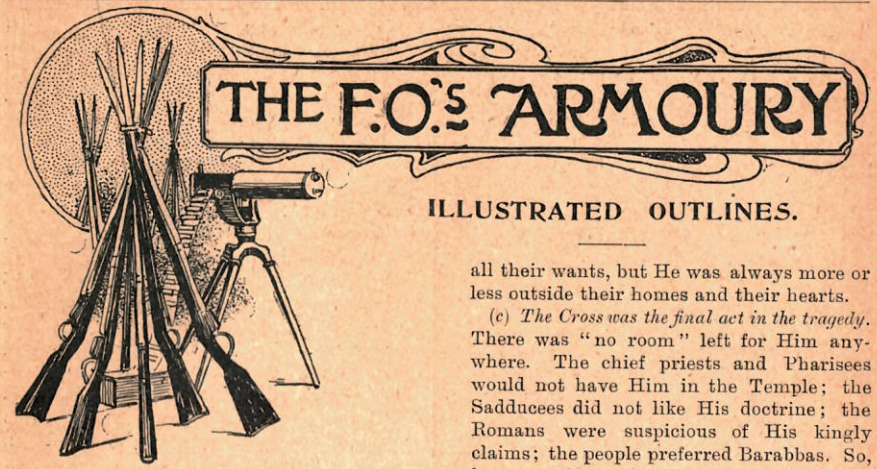

ILLUSTRATED OUTLINES.

NO ROOM FOR THE CHRIST!

"There was no room for them in the inn."— Luke ii. 7.

The most important event of the world's history was crowded out into that court-yard, among patient beasts and their humble attendants. A King so mighty that a special star is set apart to act as guide to His resting-place, and angels to herald His birth! On all God's earth there was "no room" free for His Son.

There was to be "no room" for Him; Jews and Gentiles were to unite in making that perfectly clear until they should crowd Him out of the world.

I.—THE WAY IN WHICH THIS WAS CARRIED OUT.

(a) He was refused by "His own." The Jews had every chance to recognise Him, and to welcome the long-promised Messiah. In spite of the lowliness of His surroundings, there were "signs," and fulfilled prophecies enough to satisfy really devout and seeking minds. But the Jews had no room for a Messiah Who, instead of bestowing earthly greatness, and lifting up their nation to power once more, had only poverty and goodness, humiliation and purity to offer.

(b) He was rejected by the bulk of the people, who were of mixed nations and religions. He might heal and feed them, and relieve

all their wants, but He was always more or less outside their homes and their hearts.

(c) The Cross was the final act in the tragedy. There was "no room" left for Him anywhere. The chief priests and Pharisees would not have Him in the Temple; the Sadducees did not like His doctrine; the Romans were suspicious of His kingly claims; the people preferred Barabbas. So, between them, they got Him out of the way.

II.—THE SAME SPIRIT HAS BEEN MAINTAINED FOR NINETEEN HUNDRED YEARS.

Every Christmas makes it more clear that, for the real Jesus, men are still unwilling to make room. The world likes to "keep Christmas," mainly for its own pleasure, and but little in His honour. They have no room for Christ—

(a) In their business. He would bring in the Golden Rule, and that would be inconvenient! No: wherever He comes, it must not be into the shop or the counting-house. What place in trade have His laws of not seeking your own to the injury of another; of being perfectly truthful and absolutely honest?

(b) No room in their homes. Men like to make them beautiful, but for themselves; comfortable, for their own pleasure. There is no room for a King Who will upset our comfort and claim our time and money for Himself.

(c) No room in the heart. For men desire to love someone else first, and if Jesus came in He would brook no rival. He would make His dwelling-place pure, and they cherish beloved sins. He would want to rule every thought and wish according to the law of righteousness.

It seems horribly sad and incredibly strange that this should be so; but how do we treat Him now? Have we room for
