Our Death Roll.

Captain DEVA THAI (CHARLES COX), INDIA, who came out from Oliver's, Nagerecoil, South India, on March 10th, 1892. He has had the following appointments: Trichinopoly, Cape District Headquarters, Tittuvelly District Headquarters, Halendy Men's Training Garrison, Nagerecoil. Promoted to Glory by fever on Friday, 29th December, 1893.

Son of a retired London Society's missionary, he was a devoted, capable, and much-loved officer. His death occurred while assisting in the Cape Boom March, which resulted in the capture of a number of temples and one thousand four hundred and fifty souls.

Mrs. Captain BUDGE (*nee* ELIZABETH FRY). Came out of Exeter in 1890. Appointed in November, 1890, to Whitechurch; then followed Charlbury, Owston Ferry, Broughton, Rugeley, Fairford, and on 27th February, 1893, she was married to

Captain Budge at Winchester. Together they were afterwards at High Wycombe and Banbury; from the latter place she was promoted to Glory on the 22nd January, 1894.

We deeply sympathize with the captain, who has lost a faithful helpmeet, and the War has lost a devoted warrior.

Captain HERBERT WYATT, aged 23. Out of Petersfield. First appointment, Wednesbury, 31st January, 1889, proceeding afterwards to Ryde, Wotton-under-Edge, Bath I., Banbury, Kidlington, Berkhamstead, Shepshed, Tipton, Leicester, Long Eaton and Bulwell, from which place he was promoted to Glory on 25th January, 1894, by inflammation of the lungs, brought on by scarlet fever contracted while visiting a soldier who was suffering from that disease on the Friday preceding his death. "He fell like a warrior and died at his post."
