TALKING.*

HOW TO GET THOUGHTS AND WORDS.

BY THE GENERAL.

PERHAPS no question is much more perplexing to the Officer than that which expresses itself in the words, "It is all good and true; I see what I ought to do with the people, but how can I get the thoughts and words that will accomplish it? How can I get something to say?"

He looks at the sinners before him, all cheerful and careless, full of the world and its interests, its pleasures and its gains; he wants to make them feel their condition, see their relations to God, and flee to Him for salvation. He sees the saints contented with their half-saved condition; he wants to say something that will make them seek the Purifying Blood. He sees the Soldiers indifferent to the needs of the dying world, and he wants to say something that will make

them rise up, cry to God for the Fire of the Holy Ghost, and then rush into the fight for the salvation of souls. But how is he to get the words that will accomplish it? How is he to get something to say?

THE QUESTION ANSWERED.

In answer to this question, you may teach him, as of first importance, that:—

1. *The Officer must keep his heart and life in harmony with the will and purposes of God.* He must be a vessel fitted for the Master's use. God will then make him a mouthpiece by which He will speak to men—a prophet by whom He will declare His good pleasure—a medium through which He will pour blessings of light and love and salvation.
