3. Show how we as Salvationists can aid in the saving of souls:—

- (a) We must co-operate with each other.
- (b) Must love souls.
- (c) Must feel a personal responsibility.
- (d) Must exercise in our private life the wisdom which guides the policy of the Salvation Army as a whole, in order to get men and women saved. Thus, we can attract them by a cup of tea, inviting them to meetings, giving them a *War Cry*, taking them upon our hearts, and inviting the Captain to visit them. Will every soul present take one soul upon their heart? We can have all the grace and power necessary for this given to us by God.—Captain E. Kirk.

19. The Officer who wants to fail should avoid everything like novelty. He should not attempt new ventures, or strive to push his Corps, or get

men saved by going outside the old-fashioned ways of doing things. Let him stick to the old ruts. Keep all the Open-air and Processions and everything else on the same plans and in the same places as from the beginning. He can with good effect take for his motto the saying: "As it was in the beginning in this Corps, so it is now, and so it ever shall be. Amen."

20. Don't wear yourself out with extra meetings on Sundays, or on Feasts, Fairs, or Festivals, or at any other times. To have meetings outside on such occasions, when the whole population is running after pleasure, or engaged in feasting or extra business, with a lot of drunks about who would be likely to insult you, would look as if you were mad on the subject of religion, and did not care what people said or did about you so that you could get souls saved
