THE consistent man is made mighty by his reputation. A reputation for holy living and faithfulness had, I contend, a great deal to do with the popularity of the out-and-out men who lived in the days gone by, because they dared tell the people the truth, and because they liked to have their character for being holy or a soul-winner, and his success is assured. Procure that reputation as a Salvationist, and nothing will be impossible to you—for a Salvationist has the advantage over many in that he can be more fitly compared to a city set on a hill which cannot be hid. You are a city. Climb up as high

as ever you can and let everybody know you take your stand for God and salvation. This is not inconsistent with the profession of Christ. Nobody can ever imagine Jesus Christ covering Himself up and hiding Himself, so that people should not know that He was for God. His example and teaching justify the loud profession The Salvation Army makes, and I am proud and glad of it. But if you are not consistent, then hide yourself in the cellar or attic—anywhere.
