FIELD OFFICERS' APPOINTMENTS

The spirit in which Officers accept their appointments largely decides the question of their success or failure. It is, therefore, most essential that Officers should remember the principles that underlie and govern these, and to do this it is necessary to recall the conditions under which they accepted service in The Army.

In the first place the Officer's service is voluntary. The only compulsion he knows is that of the Holy Ghost. He has heard the call of God: 'Who will go for us, and whom shall I send?' and with a burning love for Christ, and those for whom He died, he has responded: 'Here am I, send me.'

He does not volunteer in ignorance of the service to which he is called. As the Master reminded that enthusiastic volunteer of old: 'The foxes have holes, and the birds of the air have nests, but the Son of Man hath not where to lay His head,' so the would-be Officer is reminded that the position he is seeking is not a flower-strewn path, but carries with it trials and difficulties, comparative poverty, and at times loneliness and

misunderstanding, Gethsemane, cross-bearing, and Calvary. No one is cajoled into the service under the promise of an easy path with good pay. It is War, with all the sacrifices of War, for which he is enlisting.

His experience as a private in the ranks has given him some insight into the work and warfare of an Officer. When he makes his application he is not accepted till he has answered satisfactorily eighty-six questions referring to his past, present, and future, in which he declares his belief in the doctrines of The Army and in its government, accepts its conditions as to pay, marriage, etc., and after signing a most solemn Declaration in which he affirms his allegiance to its principles, and his loyalty to its leaders, he becomes an Officer.

Once enlisted, he is bound by his own agreement, by his honour, and by his religion, to be faithful. No matter though he find he has sworn to his own hurt, he changeth not. He is now under authority, and all his hours and all his powers are to be used in advancing the cause to which he has consecrated his life. He has to
