REVIVALS AS ILLUSTRATED BY RECENT AWAKENINGS*

REVIVALS and Awakenings are absolutely indispensable to the continuance of The Army. They are necessary for the renovation of Soldiers who have become tired and stale in the Service; for the restoration of those who have become open backsliders; and for the ingathering of sinners who have hitherto been indifferent to the claims of religion. For unless there is an inflow of fresh blood into the Organization, it cannot renew its youth nor even retain its vitality.

It appears to me that there is a distinction and a difference between a Revival and an Awakening. The term 'Revival' I would apply to a movement that originates within a Corps, resulting in the return to spiritual fervour and activity of Soldiers who had sunken into a state of Laodicean coldness and formality, in the forgiveness of injuries, healing of old quarrels, confession and renunciation of inconsistencies, and a re-consecration of God's people, with a consequent outpouring of the Holy Ghost, thus clearing the way for an Awakening amongst the unconverted.

An Awakening would better describe

the breaking out of conviction of sin amongst the ungodly who previously had been utterly indifferent to religion, and who had not been connected with The Army or churches.

During the past three years, some remarkable out-pourings have taken place at many of our Corps in the British Territory: Bulwell, Norland Castle, Ayr, Leyton, Congleton, Marylebone and Penge are amongst the most notable, though there are many others.

Some of these I would call 'Awakenings', as, from what I can gather, there does not appear to have been any special Revival amongst our own people first; no special seasons of prayer, or signs of quickening. Rather it has been the manifestation of the Spirit of God upon the godless and careless, and the conversion of notorious sinners that have wakened up the saints and revived them.

I make a special point of this, as we frequently hear Officers say that they never expect to get sinners saved till their own people get revived. Is not this another way of saying that God penalizes sinners, and shuts up
