Whom Should You Back as Candidates?

The Folk we Want, and the Folk we can Dispense with

THE backing of Candidates by Field Officers is of really serious importance to the well-being of The Army. It therefore follows that every F.O. should have an intelligent grasp of what is required of him by Headquarters in the way of information respecting those who make application to become Officers.

Observation

It must be clear to all that the person who should know the most about the Candidates of a Corps is the F.O. He is in closer touch with them than any other Officer in The Army. He has opportunities of observing them under all the varied circumstances of their daily life—in the Open-Air and Indoor Meetings, and in their homes when off their guard. He can listen to their ordinary conversation, find out where their chief interest in life lies, and ascertain whether they have any real love for souls such as makes them pray and labour for the Salvation of sinners apart from the fixed, regular efforts connected with the Meetings of the Corps.

The F.O. who will take the trouble to keep his eyes and ears open, who

will exercise his mind and heart in quiet observation may soon become a very encyclopædia of valuable knowledge respecting the Candidates of his Corps.

Sympathy

In order to stimulate the desire to become Officers of likely people, the F.O. should make it his constant study, both in his Meetings and his casual conversation, to magnify the importance and blessedness of an Officer's calling. He should never cease to strive to make his people realize—especially the younger men and women of the Corps—that the highest ambition of every good Soldier should be to become a soul-winner.

Selection

Constant reference to this subject should be made by the Officer in his Holiness and Soldiers' Meetings. This should be followed by personal conversation with likely and promising individuals. In most Corps, if reference to Officership is occasionally made, the F.O. will often find there are two or three individuals whose minds have been
