## Red-hot Subjects.

### II.—ON THE PROPER USE OF SALVATION ARMY REGULATIONS.

"It has never been intended that The Salvation Army should be governed merely by printed Orders and Regulations . . . Nevertheless, there must be regulations—they are a necessity . . . Regulation signifies that, so far as our knowledge extends, the particular course of action required by it is the best known, up-to-date."—THE GENERAL.

THE subject chosen for this month's "special" does not, at first sight, appear to be a very original one, yet we think it will not be found so commonplace as might be supposed. Doubtless there are many model Officers who are as familiar with the Orders and Regulations of The Army as some people are with the Scriptures, or even as the Tempter himself appeared to be; but it is the "doer" thereof who is to be commended after all.

Not that there is any intention to decry the fullest knowledge of either Bible or Regulations—Heaven forbid!—this article is intended to produce just the opposite effect; but there are not wanting grounds for fear that some people go about their work trusting to their past knowledge of both Bible and Regulations.

For instance, how often have we found, in private conversation, that a comrade has not read certain portions of his Bible (or of his Regulations) for months or years? "I read that years ago," he would say, yet close and critical questioning would find him woefully deficient in anything like accurate knowledge of the subject touched upon.
