But this has been impossible! Our work is too varied, our positions too separate. We can never hope on earth for a meeting when there shall be no vacant places. But as one great company we can each from our place in the ranks stand to renew our covenant of consecration.

As we cannot all meet, I have felt that I would like to take the next best means of reaching you, and therefore send you this letter through the pages of 'The Officer.'
