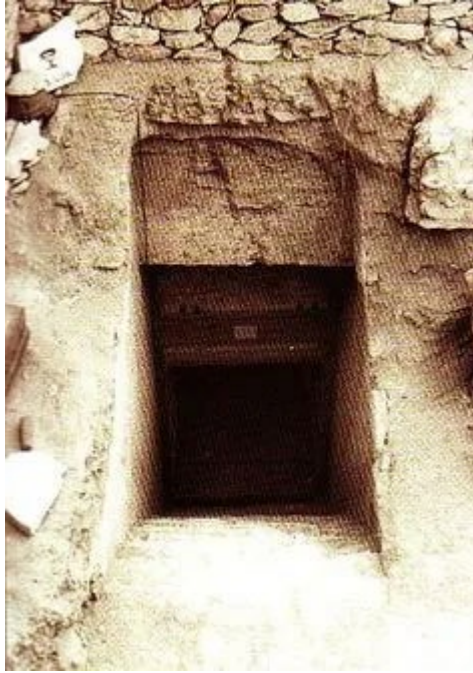

100 years ago this year, in 1922 in the Valley of the Kings near Luxor, Egypt, an Englishman named Howard Carter discovered the 3200-year-old tomb of King Tut. As the door was forced open and Carter stuck a light inside, his anxious archaeological associates asked, “What do you see?” “I see,” he said, “I see things . . . wonderful things!”

Indeed, the treasures of King Tut’s tomb are so vast that the Egyptians have built a huge museum in Cairo to house it all. There one may see gold, clothing, furniture, food, jewellery, art, idols, a throne, and, of course, the mummified corpse of the king himself.

Today we shall look into the tomb of Jesus Christ and see what there is to be found.
