There have been many attempts to represent the Ascension of Jesus in artistic form down the centuries. Some of the most comical show the apostles standing on a hillside staring up at a cloud from which a pair of feet can be seen protruding. Artists who have attempted to depict this scene have, of course, made the mistake of trying to give us a visual representation of that which is far beyond our mortal understanding. As we say every Sunday, he ascended into heaven and is seated at the right hand of the Father. How can such a thing be represented by our puny human imaginations? Rather than wrestling with a visual image we should be striving to accept the greatness of God's power and Jesus' place in that greatness.

The Ascension of Our Lord is not the end of the story, rather it is another beginning. This beginning is one in which we are called to be active participants and not spectators. Throughout his earthly life Jesus gave us a model of love and service. He called us to follow him as faithful disciples (no matter how great the cost) and he called us to go out in his name in order that others might come to know the truth and the joy of God's love in their lives.

The Ascension is one of the great mysteries of our faith. We will not come anywhere near understanding it until we stand in God's presence at the end of time. Rather than wrestling with bizarre visual images of that which our human minds cannot comprehend, let us take its message to heart. Let us not stand staring into heaven, but let us play our part in bringing the reality of that heaven into the lives of others.

### Almighty God,

as we prepare to worship today, we ask that you will stretch our imaginations to sense the majesty and mystery of your ascension.

Help us perceive how Jesus' presence in heaven can give us confidence in our praying and hope for the future.
