This is just one of the Clean Water projects that The Salvation Army in the United Kingdom and Ireland Territory supports. All money raised through the 2023 Helping-Hand Appeal will go towards supporting future Clean Water projects.

There are many elements to this far-reaching, integrated project, such as drilling boreholes, constructing toilet blocks and handwashing facilities in schools, conducting agricultural training for food security, and raising awareness about gender equality.

In Malawi, The Salvation Army is journeying with different schools and communities in the northern district of Karonga as they identify opportunities to improve access to clean water and promote hygiene and sanitation.

Water scarcity is a growing issue, with 1.42 billion people – including 450 million children – living in areas of high or extremely high water vulnerability.

In communities where water vulnerability is a daily reality, people are working together to find solutions.

Water is life!

It is children thriving. It is continued education. It is time to build your business. It is the potential for equal opportunities. It is economic independence.



HOW CAN I HELP?

- £15 could give a person clean water for life through access to a sand dam
- £45 could provide training in the maintenance of boreholes
- £470 could construct a toilet in a school
- £1450 could install a shallow well alongside a sand dam

- Pray for technical advancements that will lead to efficient and sustainable solutions to water scarcity.



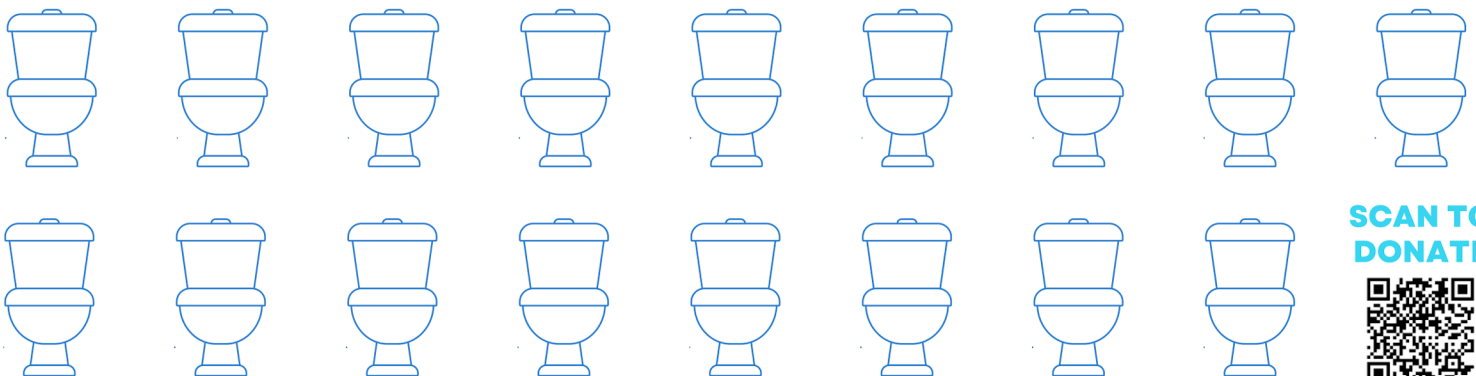
Two billion people do not have access to adequate sanitation.

Without a safe place to use the loo, people are vulnerable to disease and in danger of violence. When schools don't have private toilets, girls are more likely to skip school, damaging their education and limiting their potential.

The Salvation Army is working with schools in Kenya and Malawi to construct toilets as part of integrated clean water projects. With your help, we can ensure a lack of toilets is no longer a barrier to education.
