"If only his friend had been here, He would not have died," We say to one another. If only...If only... Is our desperate prayer.




As if one, we sucked in a surprised breath.

He told us over and over again that we were loved by one who knows our hearts, and who despises not our petitions, and that we would never be alone.


We began going to the synagogue differently. We listened to the words the Rabbi read from the ancient prophets more closely
