

Ramsgate Salvation Army Sunday 23rd July 2023




A warm welcome as we gather as the family of God today, especially if you are not normally with us on a Sunday.

And finally for Kevin who is driving aid donations on behalf of our Ukrainian friends and delivering them across the country.




Bombed church in Odessa, Ukraine, the weekend
