

And finally for **Kevin** who is driving aid donations on behalf of our Ukrainian friends and delivering them across Ukraine. Pray for his safe return this week.


WHEREVER WE ARE

GENESIS 28:10-17 '

Surely the Lord was in this place, and I was not aware of it.' (v16)

As Jacob runs from the anger of his brother Esau, a very ordinary place becomes extraordinary - God meets him. It becomes a touching point between heaven and earth. Jacob renames the place 'Bethel' - 'the house of God'. When we go to our ordinary places 'in the name of Jesus', they become the touching points between heaven and earth.
