Suggested social media timeline

18 September - 12 October- If you plan to purchase one of our temporary tattoos ahead of Anti-Slavery Day, order them during this time frame. (Delivery time should take 3-4 working days.)

13-17 October- Start posting key messages and graphics from our digital tool kit, and photos of your temporary tattoos- please remember to tag us in your content and use the relevant hashtags.

Anti-Slavery Day 18 October- If you haven't already posted your temporary tattoo pictures, apply your temporary tattoos, take pictures and post them on your social media profiles. Please tag us in your posts and use the relevant hashtags. If you don't wish to wear a tattoo, you can still participate by posting messages and images from our digital toolkit; remember to tag us in your posts. Thank you for your support!

How we help:

The Salvation Army provides specialist support for all adult survivors of modern slavery in England and Wales through a government contract which was first awarded in 2011. We provide specialist support to protect and help survivors of this heinous crime as they rebuild their lives. We also provide grants through our Survivor Support Fund which gives additional help to survivors as they move towards independent living, such as paying for rental deposits and furniture to help survivors move into a new home.
