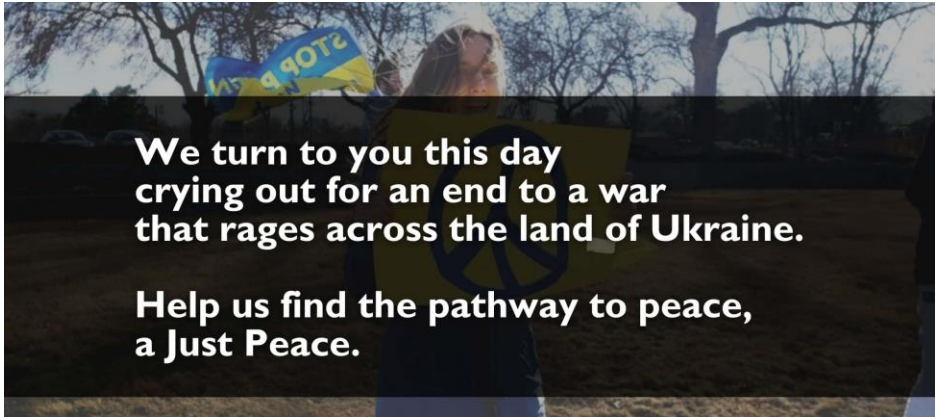
Emilie Borrough was 18 on 22/2 – belated greetings. And a mention too for Hattie since they both watch the worship services on YouTube God bless them both.

This day in 1946 saw the death in Topeka, Kansas, of Charles

Monroe Sheldon, author of the popular Christian novel *In His Steps*, from which we get the phrase “What Would Jesus Do?” My we live our lives seeking to live the Jesus way.



This weekend sees the 2nd anniversary of the full-scale invasion of Ukraine.

Ukrainian young people who are refugees in the UK were asked what we should pray for on the second anniversary of the war in Ukraine. Here is their response:

God who hears,

For two years we have prayed, mourned and lamented. Two years of war in Ukraine. Two years of invasion, of violence, of death.

Sometimes it slips from news broadcasts and from people's consciousness. But we know you, O God, have not forgotten. We hold before you refugees who still feel like strangers, unsure when or if they will ever see and hug loved ones again.

Keep safe those who remain in Ukraine. Protect them from the mental and physical wounds of war. We ask for a miraculous end to this bloodshed.

Help us, even when we feel powerless, to act where we can. To care, to listen, to sit with those who grieve. To give, to protest, to continue to pray:

Your kingdom come, your will be done on Earth as in Heaven.

Amen

We bring Al, husband of Kate, before you Lord after the tragic loss of Roy. We pray too for Kate who is far from well.

We pray for Mick, Angela's brother in law diagnosed with a tumour. Angela lost her sister, Teresa, Mick wife, last year.

We bring before you Amie (a good friend of Ellie's) who is 24 weeks pregnant and has found out that her baby has a cyst. She had an MRI on Thursday and is going back to London on Tuesday to discuss the results. Lord, we pray for the health of mother and baby.

We pray for Matthew Baldwin a friend of Bridget, who underwent major heart surgery at St Thomas Hospital several weeks ago and we pray for a speedy recovery.

We pray for Doreen, who has still not been for tests to determine what care she needs and now has to wait even longer because her appointment was cancelled.

We continue to uphold Pauline's daughters Rebecca and Karen, Pauline's sister Doreen and family friend Nick. Lord heal. We uplift Douglas to you Lord.

Remember Carol Pratt who is suffering at this time. And a friend of Kate experiencing tragedy.

We do not forget prayers for Janet's brother Graham, her son Richard and Janet herself. For Natasha's mum and for Nick's father, John. We continue to ask protection and hope for Jess as she has had to move out of area. Meet her needs Lord.

Pray for Nicole's mum Hadda and dad Ali and also her brother Abdel who is very poorly following two back surgeries' complications and serious respiratory problems. And for James, the son of MS recently in Kings College Hospital with liver complications.

Finally we pray for Babak, arrested for his Christian faith, in prison in Iran. We ask that he might soon be free. We thank the Lord that Somayyeh and Barad, his wife and son have been provided with emergency housing and pray you will place loving Christians in their path.
