PRAYER MATTERS

This week we will think about London Landmarks.

Monday 8 April – <u>THE MILLENIUM BRIDGE</u>. This is a suspension bridge linking St Paul's Cathedral to the Tate Modern. The London Millenium Footbridge opened in 2000. No cars or buses allowed making it a walk to appreciate the beauty and creation of God. Read Genesis 3 v 1-3. (Song 2 'All creatures of our God and King')

Tuesday 9 April – KEW GARDENS AND PALM HOUSE.

The Royal Botanic Gardens in Kew has 50,000 types of plants. Built between 1844 and 1848 it houses the oldest potted plant in the world, a Jurassi Cycod plant. Consider again the wonder of nature. Read Psalm 8. (Song 8 'Come, let us all unite to sing')



Wednesday 10 April – <u>SHAKESPEARE'S GLOBE THEATRE</u>. Constructed from 1000 English Oak trees and 17000 Norfolk reeds and completed in 1997. Thatched roofs in London banned since the Great Fire in 1666 but The Globe has a special license to have one. The theatre allows students to develop their literature and acting skills. Pray for students at University. Read Daniel 1 v 17-20. (Song 14 'For the beauty of the earth')

Thursday 11 April – <u>THE MONUMENT</u>. Built as a memorial to the Great Fire in 1666, the monument is 202 feet high and to reach the top you must climb 311 steps. You will be rewarded with panoramic views of London and a certificate!. It is important to view how great our world is. Pray and thank God for our environment. Read 1 Chronicles 29 v 11. (Song 20 'God of the open spaces')

Friday 12 April – <u>NELSONS COLUMN</u>. Built to commemorate Admiral Horatio Nelson, the column was completed in 1840, costing £47,000 (an equivalent of 4 million pounds today). Remembering all people who have surrendered their lives for the Nation. Read Romans 12 v 1-2. (Song 25 'God's love to me is wonderful')

Saturday 13 April – <u>THE SHARD</u>. 306 meters high, it is the tallest building in Western Europe.11000 glass panels, 44 lifts. It can be seen for 40 miles in any direction. Inaugurated are three restaurants. During construction builders found a fox on the 72nd floor and they christened him Romeo. He became the mascot of the Shard. You can buy a Romeo toy from the Gift shop. Thank God for the abilities of mankind to erect buildings of beauty and discovery. Read Psalm 139 v 13-16. (Song 31 'Holy, holy, holy, Lord God Almighty!')

Sunday 14 April – <u>ST PAUL'S CATHEDRAL</u>. Designed by Sir Christopher Wren, it is famous for the Whispering Gallery (you can hear whispers 112 feet away). As well as Christopher Wren, Lord Nelson and sculptor Henry Moore are buried there. Some of the films featured at the Cathedral are Sherlock Holmes, Harry Potter and Mary Poppins. Holman Hunt's famous painting 'The Light of the World' can be seen there. Pray for people to have a vision of new life in Christ. Read Matthew 5 v 13-16. (Song 114 'Light of the world')
