

PRAYER MATTERS

Hello! How's your year been so far? It hardly seems possible that it's four months since I last shared some thoughts with you through our 'Prayer Matters'. This week I'm focussing on the phrase 'Living in God's presence.' I hope you find these thoughts useful.

Bible verse for the week: 'You make known to me the path of life; in Your presence there is fullness of joy; at Your right hand are pleasures for evermore'. (Psalm 16:11)

Monday 6 May – Do you experience the presence of God in your daily life? Or do you go full steam ahead into the day tumbling from one moment to the next throughout the busyness of life's demands? I can't answer these questions for you, but I know that for me there are times when I am well into morning before I thank God for His presence and ask Him to spend the day with me. Suddenly, life seems so much better, still as hectic mind you, but in a calmer sort of way knowing I'm not on my own. Read James 4 v 7-8.

Tuesday 7 May – Facing the unknown is a scary proposition and yet we all must experience this in our life at some time. The apprehension of a new job or a new boss, going to a new College or University, moving house or even to a new part of the country, meeting new people, starting on a new project at work or in Church, and so the list continues. I have a verse for you today that will give you confidence and make the unknown seem less formidable. Read Deuteronomy 31 v 8.

Wednesday 8 May – Our ever-present God is always by our side we just need to reach out and touch Him through prayer, spending time in quietness, reading our bible, listening to music, or sharing with other Christians. I am so grateful for our God who understands how important it is for Him to always be there for us whenever we need Him. Aren't you? Read Joshua 1 v 9.

Thursday 9 May – Spending time in God's presence is essential to our Christian journey. If you don't spend time with a person, how can you get to know them? And so then, if you don't spend time with God, how do you expect to know Him. Maybe you set time aside each day for your devotions, maybe you pray at the start of each day, maybe you sit with a cuppa and take a break just resting in His presence. However, and whenever we spend time in His presence, we get to know Him better. Prayer: Dear Lord, help me to set aside moments when I can be still and rest in Your presence. Amen.

Friday 10 May – Bill Hybels writes: 'When you practice being aware of God's presence, you pick up His signals throughout the day. At work, at home, in your car or wherever you are, you begin a dialogue with God. It has nothing to do with being in a church building or on your knees. It has to do with God's presence in and around you'. Prayer: *Lord, help me to be so in tune with You that I pick up Your signals throughout my day. A guiding, calming influence in all that comes my way. Amen.*

Saturday 11 May – I guess, like me, you have experienced difficult times in your life, and no doubt difficulties will come our way in the future. In 1 Peter chapter 4, the message translation, we read, 'Friends, when life gets really difficult, don't jump to the conclusion that God isn't on the job'. Remember that God's prevailing power is released through prayer. He's interested in you and your need. So, hang in there, rest in His presence and tell Him how you're feeling. How does that saying go? ... 'A problem shared is a problem halved!' God certainly brings perspective into our lives.

Sunday 12 May - 'It is time that I still my restless heart and quiet my overambitious spirit' (Psalm 13 v 2), It's Sunday, take time out, quieten your mind and still your restless heart. Rest in God's presence. 'God spoke to me today; He broke through my childish doubts with words of comfort and assurance. 'Hang in there, sit tight; stick to my course in your life,' He said, 'I will not let you down.' I know that God is with me today, just as surely as He was with His saints of old. I have no reason to fear or doubt the eternal love and presence of my Lord'. (Selected verses from Psalm 110, the 'Psalms now' version).
