#### **Review - Youth Councils**

They relished the laughter that filled the air while engaging in spirited games, forging memories that would linger long after the day's events. As the sun dipped low, they made their way to the lively Village Hotel the following day, where anticipation buzzed in the atmosphere.

During our time together, a compelling call to action reverberated through the gathering, prompting us to collectively awaken to our true purpose. This urgent message drew its strength from the profound biblical passage in Revelation 3:1-3, which reminded us of the need for spiritual vigilance and renewal.

"To the angel of the church in Sardis write: These are the words of him who holds the seven spirits of God and the seven stars. I know your deeds; you have a reputation for being alive, but you are dead. Wake up!



Strengthen what remains and is about to die, for I have found your deeds unfinished in the sight of my God. Remember, therefore, what you have received and heard; hold it fast, and repent. But if you do not wake up, I will come like a thief, and you will not know at what time I will come to you."

Throughout the weekend, we absorbed a series of short yet deeply impactful messages that emphasised the importance of having 'hearts ablaze' with passion, 'eyes wide open' to the world around us, 'ears attentive' to God's whispers, and being 'dressed properly' in readiness for action. Each phrase echoed the necessity of being prepared to respond meaningfully to the needs of our lives and the communities we inhabit.



In reflective moments, we paused to scroll through our personal social media feeds, diving deep into pressing issues that weighed heavily on our hearts. Topics such as the dangers of idolatry, the pervasiveness of misogyny, and the harsh realities of violence surfaced, reminding us of the challenges that require our attention and action. These contemplative intervals were energised by bursts of laughter and playful chaos, yet they consistently drew us back to the essence of our gathering: a unified commitment to growth and awareness.

Youth councils have long served as a beloved occasion for reconnecting with friends we all too seldom see. This year, however, the alchemy of fun, fellowship, and faith forged an extraordinary atmosphere that captivated our hearts and minds. As we emerged from this enriching experience, we did so not only with renewed friendships but with a profoundly deeper grasp of our faith and a heartfelt connection to Jesus. ## **Review - Community Day**

On Saturday, 27 September, we conducted an open day for the community from 10:00 AM to 1:00 PM, during which we welcomed around 70 attendees.

Upon arrival, each guest was greeted at the entrance and provided with a guide detailing the locations of various displays and stalls, as well as a carrier bag for the collection of any complimentary items.

The event featured informative displays and activities which were strategically organized throughout the facility:

Room 1 hosted the Air Cadets, Bedlington Library, and the Stop Smoking & Social Prescribers.

Room 2 was designated for children's activities, featuring What a Hoot Nursery, a soft play area, craft activities, and complimentary refreshments for the children.

Room 3 served as a quiet and multisensory space, typically utilized for the Little Lambs program.

Room 4 provided free hot beverages and hot dogs from a service hatch, along with displays from Mind Active, The Salvation Army's Older People's Ministries, Citizens Advice Bureau & Energy Advice, the County/Town Councillor, Bedlington Churches, and Grenfell's Funeral Directors; all of which offered friendly engagement and giveaways.

In the Worship Hall, attendees had the opportunity to participate in "Come and Have a Blow," an interactive session allowing individuals to try playing a brass instrument



The outdoor area, particularly the garden at the rear, was accessible for all guests. In the car park, the Salvation Army Emergency Vehicle was present to offer complimentary hot drinks and chocolate, alongside a Fire Engine for viewing.

Overall, the event proved to be highly successful, resulting in the engagement of a new family for Sunday Worship, the recruitment of a new volunteer for the Little Lambs program, and the opportunity to connect with an individual who has consistently supported our social media initiatives over the past six months.
