A shoot from the stump of Jesse - Isaiah 11v1-10

No matter how many Christmases we have celebrated, there is always something fresh for us to discover as we move through the advent season. This week, I came across a reference to Christmas tradition that I had never heard about before – although there will be many people, I am sure, for whom this particular tradition is as familiar to them as having a turkey dinner on the big day. I'm referring to the tradition of creating a Jesse tree.

Jesse was the father of the King David of the Old Testament who is often considered as the first person in the genealogy of Jesus. The idea behind the Jesse tree is to link together the context of the people and events within the Old Testament with the glorious news of the birth of Christ in the New Testament. On each day of Advent, a story is read from the Bible about the people and events leading up to the birth of Jesus. As the stories are shared, a decoration gets placed on a tree to symbolise that story. Whereas our advent readings tend to concentrate on the Christmas story itself, the Jesse tree brings together the whole biblical context of the Christ-child, providing a profound, historical linkage between the old and new Testaments; demonstrating how it all made sense. Probably a bit late to do make a Jesse tree of your own this year, but worth considering next year, don't you think?
