At the beginning of the year we looked at the theme of 'Breaking Ground, Bringing Hope' for Covenant Sunday. As we leave Winter, signs of Spring are all around us as we see the daffodils and crocuses in bloom. These bulbs have lain dormant throughout the Winter but now ground has been broken and the hope of a new season is upon us. This word **hope** has been cropping up in many ways in the past few months. We have been following the work of The Salvation Army in Estonia, during our Self Denial Appeal in February and the tremendous work being done in the Hope House Rehabilitation Centre. The individuals in the centre have had support to free themselves from addiction and find hope once again.



In our Cameo Group in a few weeks time we will be looking at ways in which we can fundraise for the Helping Hand Appeal this year. Monies collected for the 2026 appeal will support women and girls who have experienced violence. Through skills training, literacy classes and income generating opportunities families can find hope, freedom and a new way of living.

As Christians our hope is found in Jesus Christ. He is the source of love, joy, peace and hope. Paul in his letter to the Romans encourages the followers to '**Be joyful in hope, patient in affliction, faithful in prayer.**' (Romans 12:12) This has been one of the key verses which we have focused on in the past month. It reminds us to hold on to our faith in difficult times and to bring everything to God in prayer, big or small. The Lord will never let us down or leave us, he will walk beside us and even hold us up when we are weak or weary. We might have met people in recent days in our own families or our own communities who have no hope, they are hope-less. How can we help them? We can pray for them, we can share the hope we have in Jesus Christ and we can journey with them, offering them a kind word, a cup of tea, a listening ear. All these things can make a difference, all these things can bring hope. Some words from our song book to reflect on, "His oath, his covenant, his blood supports me in the 'whelming flood. When all around my soul gives way, He then is all my hope and stay. On Christ the solid rock I stand, all other ground is sinking sand."
