Belonging

Belonging has been a theme which has cropped up in our discussions in recent weeks. In the Cameo group this month, we looked at the incredible story of how a homeless man named Ronnie was taken in by a young Christian couple Rob and Diane Parsons. Ronnie knocked on their door just before Christmas in 1975. They invited him in to stay and he never left. Ronnie's story is one of belonging. His life was transformed because he became part of a loving family and also part of a welcoming church. For the first time in his life, he belonged. This sense of belonging enabled him to serve his community and help others for many years. He wanted others to belong too.

"Where do I belong?" "How can I help other people belong?" These are important questions that we can ask ourselves when looking at our mission and ministry.

As humans we are all searching for a place where we can belong. Bella Newberry writes, "The family of Christ is a place where the stranger, the outcast and the foreigner can sit around the same table to live out our purposes and identify in Christ." There is a place for everyone in the family of God, no one is excluded.

In verse 3 of Psalm 100 we have these words, **"You know the Lord is God! He created us, and we belong to him; we are his people, the sheep in his pasture."** These words reassure us that we all belong to our Father God, we are his people, we have a place in his kingdom. He longs to look after us just as a shepherd looks after the sheep.

Thank you Father God, our Good Shepherd, that you love each and every one of us and that we can all have the invitation to belong to you. Allow us in these days O Lord to let the people we meet know that they too are loved by you and belong to you. Amen.
