Prayer Matters

Daily prayer topics compiled especially for friends of Boscombe Corps

This week I would like to share with you some Spiritual cameos from places I have lived.

Monday 6 July – In 1961 we lived in the highlands of Scotland, Kinlochleven, serving in our first Officer appointment. A village population of 1500 with a small but vibrant Corps. We were surrounded by Lochs and mountains and the scenery was amazing. From our house window I recall seeing the Golden Eagle flying over the Loch. A majestic, graceful and powerful bird of beauty, just like the Lord we serve. He is so majestic and powerful and so near to each one of us. Let us pray for such qualities in our own lives. Read Isaiah 40 v 31.



Tuesday 7 July – In the late sixties we lived in Blackburn, A busy Lancastrian city with a very competent Corps serving the community. I was privileged to be involved with the ecumenical scene and had the opportunity to preach in the Anglican cathedral. What an experience! Sharing God's word and declaring Gospel truths. Pray for the word of God to be faithfully declared. Read Mark 16 v 15.

Wednesday 8 July – In the early seventies we served as Corps Officers in Margate conducting weekly beach meetings during the summer months. The emphasis was upon the children. It

was a very challenging task and demanding but spiritually rewarding to minister to young people. Let us pray for work amongst children. We covet young people for the Lord. Read Psalm 127 v 3-5.

Thursday 9 July – In 1984 we lived in Nottingham serving as Divisional Leaders. I was invited to become chaplain to the Lord Mayor of Nottingham which was a privilege and honour. I attended numerous civic events including Royal visits, where I lunched with our guests and conducted prayers. I also visited Trent Bridge for a Cricket Test Match and again lunched with England and New Zealand teams and saying prayers. Let us pray today for our local civic leaders and those engaged in chaplaincy work. Read Romans 13 v 1-14.

Friday 10 July – We entered retirement in 2002 and resided in Hadleigh, Essex living on the Salvation Army Farm in a lovely cottage. Hadleigh Farm is an amazing centre of social and community activity. We also served as the Corps Officers at Hadleigh for a year. Pray for this work and all those committed to serve the needs of others. Read Matthew 25 v 40.

Saturday 11 July – Residing now in Bournemouth I enjoy working as a Tour guide taking foreign students on trips to such places as Winchester, the New Forest, Portsmouth, Salisbury and Stonehenge and many more places. What a beautiful country we live in. Historical wonders and natural beauty. Let us pray and give thanks to God for the wonderful world He has created. Read Ecclesiastes 3 v 11 and Psalm 104 v 1-35.

Sunday 12 July – Finally I recall in 1945 as a boy of 8 living in Portadown, Northern Island where my parents served as the Corps Officers. Through the spiritual care of a lovely lady YPSM I was converted and enrolled as a Junior Soldier. A life changing experience for me. Let us pray for all those faithful people who work for the young people of our Corps here in Boscombe. Read Proverbs 22 v 6 and Mark 10 v 13-1.
