Do not do bad things to foreigners living in your country. You must treat them the same as you treat your own citizens. Love them as you love yourselves. Remember, you were foreigners in Egypt. I am the Lord your God!

Leviticus 19:33-34 (ERV)

He is the great God. He is the amazing and powerful fighter. To him everyone is the same. He does not accept money to change his mind. He defends widows and orphans. He loves even the strangers living among us. He gives them food and clothes. So you must also love them, because you yourselves were strangers in the land of Egypt.

Deuteronomy 10:17-19 (ERV)

[Jesus said:] 'It is yours because when I was hungry, you gave me food to eat. When I was thirsty, you gave me something to drink. When I had no place to stay, you welcomed me into your home. When I was without clothes, you gave me something to wear. When I was sick, you cared for me. When I was in prison, you came to visit me.'

Matthew 25:35-36 (ERV)

The whole law is made complete in this one command: 'Love your neighbour the same as you love yourself.'

Galatians 5:14 (ERV)

'Also, when you harvest the crops on your land, don't cut all the way to the corners of your field. Don't pick up the grain that falls on the ground. Leave it for poor people and for foreigners travelling through your country. I am the Lord your God.'

Leviticus 23:22 (ERV)

Speak up for people who cannot speak for themselves. Help people who are in trouble. Stand up for what you know is right, and judge all people fairly. Protect the rights of the poor and those who need help.

Proverbs 31:8-9 (ERV)

The worship that God wants is this: caring for orphans or widows who need help and keeping yourself free from the world's evil influence. This is the kind of worship that God accepts as pure and good.
