Selling War Cry and Kids Alive! - 14 Useful Tips

- 1. Ask your officer and existing heralds how, where and when they sell their papers
- 2. Ensure you are selling in a public space and are clearly visible
- 3. Make yourself easily identifiable as 'Salvation Army'. If you are a uniformed Salvationist wear your uniform. If not, opt for a fluorescent bib with the red shield or a clearly visible volunteer badge
- 4. If you are selling on private property, such as a shopping mall, supermarket, pub or club, always obtain permission beforehand
- 5. Read the papers before you sell them, so that you are familiar with their contents
- 6. If someone comes towards you to buy a paper give them a 'hello', 'good morning', or another appropriate greeting
- 7. Encourage people to take the papers but don't be forceful as some just want to make a donation
- 8. Always smile and thank your customers
- 9. Let the magazine pages do the communication they contain the message, so don't worry if you're not confident speaking about faith
- 10. Don't get involved in unnecessary debate if someone wants to argue, be polite, listen, acknowledge their concerns and move on
- 11. Pray for the people you meet you can do this with your eyes open as you are selling
- 12. Take a notebook and pen with you there may be occasions when it is helpful to jot down information
- 13. Afterwards talk with your corps leaders about how it went
- 14. Enjoy yourself!
