

HOMELESSNESS

The Salvation Army is a Christian church and a charity. We believe everyone deserves a safe place to call home.

Jesus teaches us it is important to **help people** who are experiencing homelessness.
'I was homeless and you gave me a room.'

(Matthew 25:35 MSG)

We have been working to prevent and end homelessness – for more than 130 years. People in the homeless community often need a lot of support and can be vulnerable. We treat each person with care and respect because they are important and valued. We show them love, just like Jesus would.



We help people who do not have a home.

We give **food and support** to people **living on the street**.

We provide **emergency** and **long-term shelter** for **all ages**, including single people, couples, families and young people.

We support people with mental and physical health issues, and people living with addiction.

We give people **advice** in many areas including benefits, debt and money management.

We believe finding a **home isn't enough**– it is important to give each person the skills
and confidence **to live their best possible life**.

IN NUMBERS

In the **UK and Ireland** roughly:

- 320,000 households need help to stop them being homeless
- 10,000 people experience sleeping rough each year

People stay at our **Lifehouses** and receive specialised help, rebuilding their lives with training and support.

Our **drop-in centres** give help like advice, food, a shower, counselling, medical aid and friendship – all in one place.



We encourage people to express themselves through activities like art, drama, gardening, singing and sport.

Homelessness support:

- 86 Lifehouses with 3,150 places every night
- 8 centres with accommodation for 134 families
- 4 specialised centres for teenagers and young adults

We campaign to raise awareness, to introduce laws to protect people and to stop homelessness from happening.

GLOSSARY

hidden homelessness

When the authorities do not know a person has **no home** and so they receive **no support**; often they stay **with friends/family** eg 'sofa-surfer'

homeless

The situation when someone has no place they would call home or a permanent place to live

Lifehouse

Salvation Army accommodation supporting people who are experiencing homelessness

rough sleeping

A term used when a person usually **sleeps outside** (including in a tent or a makeshift shelter)
